

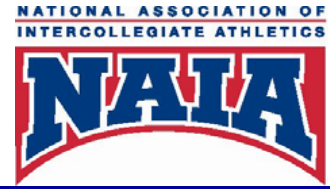

Ron Mann

Coach Mann led the men's and women's cross country and track and field coach at Northern Arizona University for the past 24 years, but was recently tapped to take the helm as cross country and track and field coach at the University of Louisville. A coaching legend at Northern Arizona since his arrival there in 1980, Mann guided 16 top ten NCAA finishes while producing 107 All-Americans, five Olympians and four individual national champions. Coach Mann has earned 57 league Coach of the Year awards. Last fall, Mann's NAU men's cross country team finished third in the nation while the women placed 15th as six athletes earned All-America honors. Both teams won Big Sky Conference titles. He is a three-time member of the NAU Athletics Hall of Fame as an individual in 1999 and previous as athlete and coach of two championship cross country teams. He also served as head coach of the U.S. Junior National Team at the 1993 Pan American Games.

Jeff Arbogast

Coach Arbogast combines cutting edge distance training theory, team management, innovative applications of workout structure, and insights into the physical and mental athlete with an extreme willingness to share every aspect of a national program. One of only two coaches in US history to win both girls' and boys' national XC championship and one of 4 US coaches to reach USATF Level III Endurance certification, he has had numerous Footlocker Finalists, Junior Pan-Am Games competitors, and Junior World Team members. His XC teams have enjoyed three decades in the national rankings. The hallmark of his program is long-term collegiate preparation with over 70 NCAA athletes represented on collegiate programs, the most of any school known.

Joe Newton

Joe Newton is without question the most successful high school cross country coach in the United States. His boys' cross country teams have won an unprecedented 19 national championships, 23 state championships, and 113 conference titles. They have also won an impressive 98% of their home meets. Newton's coaching accomplishments have earned him a long list of awards and honors. He has been named High School Cross Country Coach of the Year 16 times by the Northern Illinois Track Coaches Association and 15 times by the Illinois High School Coaches Association. In 1988, Newton was chosen as one of the coaches of the U.S. men's track and field Olympic team in Seoul, South Korea. He was the first high school coach to ever receive this honor. Known as a master motivator, Newton is a frequent guest speaker at corporate meetings and social gathering around the United States. He has delivered his message of teamwork, commitment, and discipline more than 5,000 times. He has also put his philosophy of coaching and life into print in his three books: **Running to the Top of the Mountain**, **The Long Green Line**, and **Motivation: The Name of the Game**.
